Students will have the opportunity to experience, build, and explore important skills outside of the typical classroom setting. They will be introduced to an ice-breaker activity that involves personal- and career-based discussion questions, as well as a skit where students will have the opportunity to explore their creativity and perform their opinions on the topic through drama and improvisation. The theme will be concluded with a mock-networking event that allows students to dress up in business attire and learn about professionalism and the importance of reaching out to different contacts.
